

## DALLAS ART FAIR

Our presentation includes Beverly Pepper and Peter Halley: Between Chaos and Order, a selection of Halley's Day-Glo geometric paintings juxtaposed with Pepper's reflective stainless steel sculptures.

In the late 1960s and early 1970s, Pepper worked extensively with stainless steel, having recently realized the potential of working with industrial materials in factories to produce her sculptures. Across both American and Italian landscapes, Pepper used polished stainless steel to reflect her surroundings, incorporating the organic forms of the natural environment into the hard geometric planes of the works.



Peter Halley heavily influenced the Neo-Geo movement in the 1980s with a series of eight essays he published in Arts Magazine, in which he described the "geometricization of modern life." Halley is particularly interested in the geometry of cities, explaining that "hyperrealization is usually used to describe the jump between industrial culture (the real) and post-industrial culture (which is hyperreal)... The process of hyperrealization is vividly seen in a single urban landscape—such as that of New York. The walk-up row house is hyperrealized into the large elevator-serviced apartment building."

"Landing in downtown New York [in 1980], I suddenly understood that my obsession with geometry was coming from this complex built environment, from the way the spaces around me were organized."

While Pepper famously looked towards antiquity and the natural landscape for inspiration, her work also takes industrial culture as its jumping-off point; she worked primarily in factories to produce her work and constantly experimented with new metals and techniques. Pepper too considered the geometry of the modern urban environment as she worked:

"Opposing forces give a dynamic to the work...
They are also integral to our lives spent immersed in urban landscapes where geometry dominates, just as they respond to tensions between experiential material and abstraction or conceptual thought, between extremes such as chaos and order, chance and regime."

Pairing Pepper's deceptively minimal sculptures with Halley's Day-Glo paintings brings these opposing forces together through a shared language of geometric abstraction, with Halley's fluorescent, textured canvases playing off the smooth, polished surfaces of Pepper's sculptures.




























Black Man, White Woman, 1977 gelatin silver print  $24 \times 20$  inches Edition of 2/10














Untitled (12.3.90), 1990 ink on paper 16 7/8 x 12 7/8 inches (42.9 x 32.7)
